

## Election Season in Broadview Raises Concerns Over Taxpayer Funds

As election season gets underway in Broadview, troubling issues regarding the misuse of taxpayer funds have come to light. During the recent Board of Trustees meeting, Clerk Kevin McGrier addressed the significant financial impact caused by challenges to candidates running for the Village of Broadview, the Park District, the Library, and the Lindop School District. These challenges, initiated by Princess Dempsey and Angela Patterson, have already cost taxpayers over \$5,300, and this amount continues to grow.

Clerk McGrier expressed deep concern over these expenditures, highlighting how such politically driven actions place an unnecessary financial burden on the community. These funds, which belong to Broadview residents, could have been better used to support vital local programs,

services, and improvements.

With the stakes high during local elections, Clerk McGrier's statement serves as a call to prioritize ethical practices and responsible governance. Broadview residents deserve leaders who focus on advancing the community's best interests rather than engaging in costly and divisive political disputes.
